Priority: Teaching and Learning

Outcome: Intentional focus on effective planning and instructional practices that meet the learning needs of every student.

Strategies:

- Classroom instruction and assessment prioritizes literacy and numeracy.
- Professional Learning focuses on quality instructional and assessment practices.
- Staff builds capacity regarding student assessment that is appropriate, fair and evidence informed.
- Focused discussions on teachers' progress to impact student engagement and learning as evident in observations and feedback.
- Instructional strategies support the learning needs of individual students.
- Systematic and explicit phonics instruction.
- Mathology, Math-Up Professional Development for teachers.
- New Curriculum Meetings with Division Coordinators
- Explicit social emotional learning instructional and/or integrated with academic instruction.
- Access to Multi-disciplinary Team for professional development in Mental Wellness.
- Mentorship and support for staff includes professional development with LearnAlberta.
- Teacher led explicit whole group instruction.
- Tiered intervention of support for students.
- Providing learning opportunities / support to prekindergarten parents through familyoriented programming

Evidence

Outcome: Swanavon is a welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environment for our school community.

Strategies

- Explicitly teach Self-Regulation Strategies Zones of Regulation, Mindfulness, Growth Mindset, Social Thinking, Character Education, Dialectical behavior therapy (DBT)
- Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies (PATHS) curriculum in classrooms.
- Roots of Empathy
- Student Centered Collaborative Team Meetings School Family Agencies
- Whole school presentations on the importance of and building understanding of diverse cultures - acceptance, understanding, values and beliefs of all students
- Parent engagement in cultural celebrations and teachings
- Elder Darlene sharing Indigenous Cultural Foundational Knowledge weekly with students and staff
- Student citizenship opportunities within each classroom and around the school AMA patrollers, recycling, shoveling
- Welcoming start to our day morning announcements by staff and students
- Understanding trauma behaviours and impact on student learning
- RCMP Safety in our School, Community and Online Presentation with our 4-6 students
- School Website, Engaged positive social media posts, consistent communication with staff students, parents, and community stakeholders
- Monthly Newsletters
- Monthly School Council Meeting
- Enhance community connections
- Consistent communication with families to support student attendance
