How Long to Stay Home From School:

COVID-19 INFORMATION HOW LONG TO STAY HOME FROM SCHOOL

The amount of time a student needs to stay home from school depends on the type of symptoms. For more details: <u>Isolation requirements</u>

If a student has these symptoms	What to do				
 Fever Cough Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing Loss of sense of smell or taste 	 Isolate at home for a minimum of 10 days from when symptoms started or until symptoms resolve, whichever is longer. COVID-19 testing is recommended. Can return to school before 10 days only if a COVID-19 test is negative, symptoms are gone, and the student was not a close contact of someone with COVID-19. Do not enter any long-term care settings for 10 days and until symptoms have resolved. If test results are positive, isolate at home for at least 10 days and follow instructions received from Alberta Health Services. 				
One of the following symptoms: Chills Sore throat/painful swallowing Runny nose/congestion	 Stay home from school and monitor for 24 hours. If after 24 hours your symptoms improve, you may return to school when you are feeling better A COVID-19 test is not required but is available. Do not enter any long-term care settings for 10 days and until symptoms have resolved. 				
 Headache Muscle or joint aches Feeling unwell/fatigued Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea 	If a child has any two of these symptoms, or after 24 hours, their condition gets worse or they develop a second symptom: COVID-19 test recommended. 				
 Nausea, vorning of diamea Unexplained loss of appetite Muscle/joint aches Headache Pink eye (conjunctivitis) 	 May return to school after symptoms are gone, even without a COVID-19 test or results. Do not enter any long-term care settings for 10 days and until symptoms have resolved. If test results are positive, isolate at home for at least 10 days and follow 				

instructions received from Alberta Health Services.

SWANAVON Parent Guide: Learning while in Quarantine

This year all PK-6 students at SWANAVON have Google accounts, with access to Google Classrooms or Google Sites that can be used and accessed while at school and while at home. Parents it is IMPERATIVE that you have your child setup on Google Classroom at home. Your child's teacher would have shared your child's username and password in an email with you. We are asking that you have your child setup by October 16. Please reach out to your child's teachers if you are experiencing difficulty logging on. They are here to help and support you through this process.

What is a Google Site?

Google Sites are websites teachers can modify to create a unique classroom website.

What is Google Classroom?

Google Classroom is an online classroom. It makes it easy to create classes, distribute assignments, communicate, and stay organized. Google Classroom increases the ease at which students can hand in assignments from home.

What is Google Meet?

Google Meet is a conference software like Zoom that teachers can use to teach live, interactive lessons online.

ONE SCHOOL YEAR = 40 Weeks,


When students are absent for;
